But you can read again what you did in fact found for "autonomy", which is "PBL did not significantly enhance students' autonomy. The magnitude of the effect is probably quite small." **I understand that you have used self-efficacy as a mediator. But it is not clear to me how the authors have presented their results on this mediator. Could you help us to understand this please?** Table 1 showed that the total effect of PBL on autonomy is 0.08 which is not statistically significant. The effect of PBL on self-efficacy as a mediator is 1.69 which is significant. The mediating role of self-efficacy is positive in the relationship between PBL and autonomy was 0.08 which is not statistically significant at the 0.05 level. In fact, the 95% CI for the total effect was not statistically significant at the 0.05 level (-0.15-0.34) because the 95% CI did not include the zero value (-0.21-0.10), which is statistically significant. This suggests that there is a negative and significant indirect effect of PBL on autonomy. However, the confidence interval (-0.34-0.12) did not contain the true value, which is 0.13. "R2 is 0.04 in step 1 and 0.06 in step 2, which indicates that the relationship is statistically significant.
